International fundraising campaign

As of 1 November, 2014, the campaign has raised: 1,357,673 euros, that is:

- 100,000 euros from the Fondation du Patrimoine
- 50,000 euros from the Souvenir Napoléonien
- 50,000 euros from the Fondation Napoléon
- 1,005,113 euros from private donors
- 143,270 euros from companies and associations
- 8,000 euros from interest on investments.

The government of St Helena is to finance a restoration report costing $\in 80,000$.

Expenditures, financial commitments, and budget forecasts

- 700,000 euros assigned to the "Generals' Wing" (total budget of 1.4 million euros, that is: 50% funded by campaign, 50% funded by French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs)
- 75,000 euros for work on Longwood apartment interiors
- 415,000 euros for Longwood furniture (including transportation, restoration work, and exhibition in Paris)
- 102,673 euros for a special investment fund
- 20 000 euros in reserve for unexpected costs and budget overruns
- 45,000 euros for general expenses (printing of fundraising documents, franking, sundries). The total will not exceed 4% of the sum raised.
